First Manufacturers Alliance Manufacturers Day a Success

The Manufacturers Alliance of New York, a partnership between the Manufacturers Association of Central New York, The Council of Industry and the Chief Executive Network, held what they hope will be the first of many Manufacturing Days, January 28th in Albany. The day was an opportunity to rally together and convey to Albany elected officials their legislative agenda for the upcoming session.

Alliance President Randy Wolken opened the program, along with Alliance Vice President Harold King, by presenting the legislative priorities for the Manufactures Alliance. These priorities are the result of a survey of manufacturers across the state. The top five issues are:

Assembly Minority Leader James Tedisco addressed the gathering of more than 50 manufacturing executives. He welcomed their input and expressed his appreciation for their help in pushing for a pro- growth, pro- business agenda in Albany.

Senate Majority Leader Joseph Bruno delivered a lunchtime keynote address where he presented a 10 point plan to revitalize New York State. It focuses on cutting taxes, reducing the costs of energy and health care, and workforce development. Senator Bruno too hopes manufacturers can help him implement this plan that includes:

- 9. Providing Around the Clock Access to the State's Economic Development Programs
- 10. Marketing Upstate's Outstanding Recreational, Cultural and Tourism Opportunities
